Sheriff Sniff has over 33 years of law enforcement experience. He joined the Coachella Police Department in 1975 and transferred to the Riverside County Sheriff's Department in 1979. His initial expertise was in traffic enforcement and accident investigation and he was instrumental in creating the Department's first specialized traffic safety programs.

As a Captain he held command assignments of the Robert Presley Detention Center in Riverside, the Banning Sheriff's Station and the Ben Clark Training Center. As a Chief Deputy he held assignments over Training and Personnel, East and West county patrol operations. As an Assistant Sheriff he was assigned oversight of all county court operations, jail operations and patrol operations division. Sheriff Stanley was appointed as the 13th Sheriff of Riverside County by the Board of Supervisors to complete the remaining term of his predecessor, starting on October 2, 2007.

Sheriff Hoops began his career with the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department in 1978 and served in numerous facets of the department. He has served as a Deputy Sheriff, Supervisor, Commander and Executive Staff member. He was a member of the Department's Career Criminal Division (S.W.A.T.), Legislative Liaison in Sacramento, Chief of Police of Grand Terrace and Loma Linda.

As a member of the Sheriff's Executive Staff, Sheriff Hoops oversaw all patrol and specialized operations. He was responsible for the Department's budget, long-range planning and was the direct liaison with County Department Heads, Chief Administrative Officer and elected officials. Sheriff Hoops was appointed Sheriff on February 3, 2009, to complete the term of Sheriff Gary Penrod. Sheriff Hoops, his wife Monica and his son Andrew currently reside in Highland, CA.
